The Program

Heartland CAMP is a scholarship program that helps students from temporary and seasonal farmwork backgrounds successfully complete their first year of college.

CAMP Scholar Benefits

- Financial Assistance
(Tuition scholarship, living stipend, loaner laptop)
- Academic Support
(Bi-weekly advising, tutoring, success course, referrals to resources)
- Social Support
(Cultural events, campus involvement, family events)
- Beyond the Freshman Year
(Connections to other support programs, help finding scholarships/financial aid, advising, mentorship opportunities)

Applying

Contact a CAMP Specialist at your college to learn more about the program, to determine your eligibility, or to request an application.

Eligibility

- U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Current or former farmworker (you or your parents - see below)
- Enroll as a full-time freshman student
- Pursue an associate's or bachelor's degree

Who is a migratory/seasonal farmworker?

A person who moves to work in seasonal or temporary agricultural work (e.g. meatpacking, dairies, feed yards, pig farms, nurseries, fisheries, harvesting crops, etc.). If you or your parent(s)/ guardian(s) have ever done this type of work...you may be eligible for CAMP!

Note! Migrant does NOT mean immigrant.

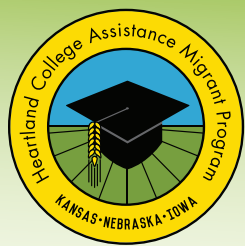

Heartland CAMP es un programa de beca que ayuda a estudiantes con historia de trabajo agrícola de temporada o temporal a cumplir exitosamente su primer año en el colegio o la universidad.

Beneficios

- Asistencia Financiera
(Beca de colegiatura, estipendio para libros o vivencia, computadora)
- Apoyo Académico
(Consejería intensiva, tutoría gratis, curso especial para estudiantes del 1^{er} año, conexiones a otros programas y oportunidades)
- Apoyo Social
(Eventos sociales, conexiones con organizaciones estudiantiles, eventos de familia)
- Después del 1^{er} Año
(Conexiones a otros programas y apoyo, ayuda buscando becas y ayuda financiera, consejería, y oportunidades para ser mentores)

Para Solicitar

Contacta a un especialista de CAMP en tu colegio para aprender más sobre el programa, determinar tu elegibilidad, o pedir una solicitud.

Elegibilidad

- Ciudadano o Residente Permanente
- Actualmente o anteriormente elegible como trabajador agrícola (tu o tus padres – lee abajo)
- Matriculado como estudiante de tiempo completo
- Intención de sacar un diploma de asociado o la licenciatura.

¿Quién es un trabajador agrícola temporal / de temporada?

Una persona que se mueve para un trabajo agrícola temporal o de temporada como en las matanzas, lecherías, engordas de vacas y cerdos, viveros de plantas, pesquería, la cosecha, etc. Si tu o tus padres/tutores han hecho este tipo de trabajo...puede ser que seas elegible para CAMP!

¡Notar! ¡Migrante no es inmigrante!

- College transcript (*if you have earned any college credit*)

Financial Documents

- Student Aid Report (SAR) - login to fafsa.ed.gov to print

- * First Paragraph – describe your educational goals and what motivates you to pursue a higher education. Describe the specific steps you will take to reach these goals.
- * Second Paragraph – describe your need for the support services offered by CAMP (financial, academic, social, etc.).
- * Third Paragraph – describe your family background and how your family is supporting your goal to attend college. Describe possible family challenges that may arise while you attend college or live away from home.
- * Last Paragraph – include any other information about yourself or your family that you believe is important for the selection committee to know.
